She is adjunct professor of theology at Nazarene Theological Seminary and Northwest Nazarene University, and Director of Pastoral Formation on the Southern California District.

Transitioning From A Black Church To A Multicultural Ministry

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:

On the emerging of our journey to transitioning two separate churches; a black church and a white church to a cross-cultural ministry. "Is it possible?" was the question that waited an answer. Considering the culture and geographical location, some people didn't think it could happen. Others thought, perhaps possible. However, there were those who believed that the time had come for a new move. It was believed that this was a move of God that He would have us embrace. We are blessed to be in a country where we are called to witness Christ's power and break down walls that divide. "He has committed to us the message of reconciliation." 2 Corinthians 5:11. As people of faith we will move with God.

WORKSHOP PRESENTERS: DR. CARL LETH and REV. ROBERT LANIER

Dr. Carl Leth is a theology professor in the Department of Theology & Philosophy, and teaches such courses as Christian Theology, Preaching & Worship and Theology in an Era of Reformation. He is also the director of the Center for Faith and Culture.

From 2005 to 2015, he was the dean of the School of Theology and Christian Ministry. He served as the chair of the Department of Theology and Christian Ministry from 2003 to 2005. From 2012 to 2015, he held the University's first-ever endowed chair, the Reverend Dr. Fay Quanstrom Chair of Pastoral Ministry.

Prior to Olivet, Dr. Leth pastored Detroit First Church of the Nazarene in Novi, Mich., and North Raleigh Church of the Nazarene in Raleigh, N.C. He also served for four years as a missionary on specialized assignment in Kaiserslautern, Germany. In addition, Dr. Leth is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps.

At Olivet, Dr. Leth has served on many different teams and committees, including the University Leadership Team, the Dean's Cabinet, the General Education Committee, the Graduate Affairs Commission, the Rank and Service Committee and the Honorary Degrees Committee. He has also served on the Ministerial Studies Board & Ministerial Credentials Board of the Chicago Central District of the Church of the Nazarene and on the Professional Consultation Committee of Riverside Medical Center in Kankakee, III. He is also a member of the Wesleyan Theological Society.

He has been widely published in such magazines as Preacher's Magazine and Holiness Today and has contributed articles for books such as Mirror Image, Teach Us to Pray and Discover the Word. He has also written, A Holy Encounter, published in 1998 by Beacon Hill Press of Kansas City.

Rev. Robert Lanier is the pastor of the New Vision Church of the Nazarene in Jackson, Mississippi. New Vision Church of the Nazarene is knocking down walls — walls between cultures, races and churches.

Two discrete Nazarene churches merged, one predominately African-American and the other predominately white, under Rev. Lanier's leadership, for the first time in Mississippi history.

New Vision was the product of this unification in April 2016.

He has served on numerous denominational boards and committees over the years, and presently serves as Multicultural Facilitator for the USA/Canada Region.
