Holly Catterton Allen is professor of family studies and Christian ministries at Lipscomb University in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. Allen teaches courses in early childhood development and family ministry, and she has previously taught at John Brown University, Biola University and Abilene Christian University. Dr. Allen's areas of research are children's spirituality and intergenerational issues. She is the coauthor of Intergenerational *Christian Formation: Bringing the Whole Church Together in Ministry, Community and Worship* and the editor of *Nurturing Children's Spirituality: Christian Perspectives and Best Practices*.
