

### From the Editor

As a boy growing up in the Church of the Nazarene, I was blessed to have teachers and preachers who explained to me the doctrines of our church. The reason for our existence as a denomination was to emphasize the scriptural call to holy living as born again people. I learned early that sanctification is more than a second trip to the altar or just a second work of God's grace. Sanctification is God's overall plan to deliver a fallen race back to a right relationship with Him. The plan has a beginning, middle, and end.

As an evangelist I have tried to cover the entire plan as much as possible when invited to hold revival services. My understanding of the plan is: the process of conviction, the crisis of the new birth, the process of walking in the light, the crisis of death to self and making Jesus Lord of all, and the process of daily obedience to the Lord. It is this last point that I want to address.

Dr. Tom Hermiz emphasizes that there is a big difference between purity and maturity. In over fifty years of ministry I have known hundreds if not thousands of people who have been able to give a definite testimony of the crisis experiences of salvation and entire sanctification. Every now and then someone will go further and testify that God is still refining His new creation. These people had not "backslidden," but they wanted to emphasize they were still walking in the light. Usually this was light that they had not seen before.

As the Holy Spirit teaches us all things, most of the lessons are very gentle. However, at times, the lesson jolts us a bit. I have observed that the older I become, the more frequent these jolting lessons come.

Several years ago, I was invited by a young new pastor to hold a revival in his church. This young pastor had grown up in the Nazarene church, so I assumed that he had a similar conversion story to mine. After service one night we went to a local restaurant for a meal. The background music was very loud and to make it worse, it was "rap" music. After we had shouted out our order to the waitress, I commented on the song by saying, "That is the most ignorant form of communication ever devised by man!" The pastor graciously smiled and said, "I got saved at a Christian rap concert." Have you ever seen the TV commercial asking if you would like to get away?

played football in Having high school and college as a fullback and defensive end I enjoyed delivering what Coach John Madden called a "slobber knocker." That is an event where the one receiving the delivery does not see it coming, with the result being total disorientation. The Holy Spirit used the gracious young pastor's response as an "SK" to give me new light. Obviously, it is more fun to deliver one than to receive one.

A few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to talk with Ben, who is married to my niece Ann. They are both graduates of Ohio State University. Ann is a pharmacist and Ben teaches in the public schools in Columbus. Ben is also a small group leader in a larger contemporary church. Our Thanksgiving family reunion included both traditional and contemporary worship style loyalists.

Ben and I managed to get alone for a few minutes. Eventually, Ben shared that so many of the "new" converts in their church had no church background from which to gauge worship style, doctrine, or even behavior. He shared something that I should have seen before. He said many of the new converts had been introduced to Jesus through non-traditional ministries. Almost everything, including the music that they love, is associated with the place or ministry that introduced them

to Jesus. This helped me to listen to the continuing teaching ministry of the Holy Spirit. This was not an "SK" moment, but a tap on the head!

I was introduced to Jesus in a sanctuary in a beautiful church in Chicago with a choir, piano and organ. The preacher, who was dressed in a suit, delivered a powerful Biblical message and gave an altar call. My favorite musicians were Jim Bohi. Jim and Rosemary Green, Martha Garvin. The Blackwood Brothers, The Speer Family, and the Orpheus choir from ONU. Ben reminded me that we tend to associate all these things with the day we met Jesus. I will admit that this traditional style is still my preference.

#### **Creation Embraces Glorification**

The opening words of Genesis are very far-reaching. When we read, "In the beginning God created," we must not overlook the depth of meaning of that phrase. Implicit in this statement is that from creation to glorification, God has made provisions for all eventualities. God made human beings responsible, moral creatures capable of making choices: He placed Adam in the Garden of Eden to care for it (Genesis 2:15). He then gave Adam a command: "Of every tree of the garden thou may freely eat: but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. thou shall not eat of it: for

in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shall surely die" (Genesis 2:16-17). This demonstrates that human beings were created with a sense of "ought" and "ought not."

In Genesis 3, human beings rebelled against the will of God, demonstrating base ingratitude and unbelief. This brought sin and death into the world. Inaddition to the tragedy of humanity's disobedience, it also records the first promise of redemption. The story of Genesis leading up to this point prepares us for an announcement from God: "the seed of the woman

shall bruise the serpent's head" (Gen. 3:15). Henceforth, the whole Bible will have redemption for its main theme.

The good news is that before Adam and Eve sinned, God had a plan for redemption: Jesus Christ was "the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world" (Rev. 13:8). Methodist expositor Joseph H. Smith stated, "While there hangs a death sentence over all our heads in that 'all have sinned and come short of the glory of God' (Rom. 3:23), the slaying of the Lamb 'before the foundation of the world' has unconditionally secured. . a parole, or a deferred execution of sentence, to allow all. . . a chance to seek the shelter of Calvary's cross."

A number of scriptures imply that a plan of redemption was in place even before the creation of humanity. Ephesians 1:4 states: "He has chosen us in Him before the foundation of the world." In I Peter 1: 19-20, we read that human beings are "redeemed with the precious blood of Christ, as of a Lamb without blemish and without spot: Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world but was manifest in these last times for you." These passages, along with Rev. 13:8, reveal that salvation was to be available for all. Jesus was typified by the Old Testament sacrifices and offerings. The animal sacrifices were pointing to Christ, who would be the

Lamb of God sacrificed on Calvary's cross.

How could God offer provision for salvation before the crucifixion? In answer to that question I want to give a rather lengthy response from H. A. Hanke's work entitled "Christ and the Church in the Old Testament." He answers it with an analogy of life.

"Through the operation of a note at a bank, a penniless man can enjoy all the financial benefits that he would be able to enjoy otherwise with a pocket full of money. The maker of the note agrees to redeem the note---to make full settlement at some future date, and on the basis of this promise the banker opens his vault and makes available the treasure therein. By this analogy, God's redemptive promissory note has been given to the human race. God, who "cannot lie" has promised or pledged to redeem the note at some future date by payment of His Son on the cross. The date of this note was "the fullness of time" (Gal. 4:4). God's redemptive note was sufficient legal tender for people to enter the Kingdom of heaven. The only requirement was that they should repent of their sins and have faith in the Maker of the note. By faith, the saints of the Old Testament were able to draw checks of salvation on the bank of heaven with full realization that the note would one day be fully redeemed." Hanke concludes that "in the fullness of time, God redeemed His promissory note on the cross. Of Abel, Enoch, Noah, and Abraham it is said, 'these all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of them and embraced them....'

When Adam and Eve broke God's law, they brought about the reality expressed in Exodus 18:4: "The soul that sinneth, it shall die." Adam and Eve knew the consequences of their actions. They were without excuse for their disobedience. Therefore, the only hope for humanity is found in the atonement of Christ. A Redeemer is needed; a Savior must come. Without Christ there is no hope.

But thank God we have a Redeemer! Through Christ, God has provided that "whosoever will" may be saved. "We have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins," (Eph. 1:7). "Wherefore Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people with His

own blood suffered without the gate" (Heb. 13:12).

According to Scripture, God's plan of redemption was a necessary provision for not only salvation but also for glorification. When one examines Scripture, it becomes obvious that history is truly His-story. The commentator Matthew Henry stated: "In creation God had only to breathe, but in redemption He had to bleed." The hope of all comes in the fact that Christ was the embodiment of love, light, and life. Jesus offered Himself as a lamb "slain from the foundation of the world."

God saves men and women joined to the second Adam. We will one day will be lifted out of the wreckage and ruin of this present order of creation and gathered into the final new creation of God to inhabit while the ages roll. Let us be faithful until our race is run and the crown is won.



## EVANGELIST CHARLES SHAVER

nly a few people in the Church of the Nazarene are known worldwide by their first names, but one of them is Charles "Chic" Shaver. When you consider the scope of his life and ministry, it's hard to begin to tell it all within the boundaries of one small article. His life story, his passion for the lost and for soul winning, his teaching, writing, and worldwide influence for the cause of Christ and evangelism have made an eternal impact for the Kingdom of God.

Dr. Shaver's life really began while he was a student at the prestigious lyy League Dartmouth College. He was an honor student in law, preparing for a profession in that challenging field. Any of us who know him could easily see him in a courtroom. But his life really began when he had a personal encounter with Jesus Christ through the influence of a Christian classmate.

There he gave his heart and life to Christ and soon after changed the direction of his life and studies. Over time, Chic became aware of a definite call to ministry, which he has followed to this day as an ordained Nazarene evangelist.

During his years at Dartmouth, Chic was the type of guy who loved the activities of the college. He fondly remembers being a part of the gang that built the tallest, (and thus the greatest), railroad tie bonfire of all the Ivy League schools prior to a football game. From his college years to the present day, Chic remains more than just a brilliant scholar in an ivory tower. Though he is certainly a professor of academic excellence, Chic also joyfully relates to and is interested in everyone. have shared a camp meeting platform with him, as well as some great days as students together at Nazarene Theological Seminary, and



it's been a privilege to experience the range of his many insights and interests.

In the early part of his ministry, Dr. Shaver pastored two home mission churches. His calling soon led him into full-time evangelism and later to a position as the Frank and Gladys Cooper Professor of Evangelism at Theological Seminary. Nazarene where he served for 30 years. His impact on a whole generation of students will only be revealed in heaven. Throughout his ministry, his wife Nancy has been a steady and gracious support. The Shavers have three children: Rachel Paul and Miriam.

Dr. Shaver's preaching, teaching, writing, and recordings have touched the church near and far. Of all the books he has written, one in particular has met a huge need for reaching and guiding new Christians. Later in his ministry, Chic became aware of an immense need to follow up with new Christians on the various parts of growing in grace. So, with God's help, he wrote his first edition of "Basic Bible Studies." a series still in print and very much in demand. This remarkable little series has now been printed in over 55 languages including more than 75,000 copies in English.



In July of 2008, Dr. Shaver was presented with the Distinguished Service Award by World Mission Literature. Nazarene Missions International, and Kansas City First Church of the Nazarene. The citation read on this occasion said. "Your commitment and passion reaching the lost and discipling new believers is evident through your Basic Bible Studies. The Albanian translation [the 50th language] makes this the most translated piece of literature ever in the Church of the Nazarene "

Chic's life has been dedicated to teaching and preaching in revivals, conferences, and conventions all over the world. He is still vibrant to the core. He is a constant soul-winner. 


