Billy Huddleston, a tenured evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene, has been in the field of full-time evangelism since 1998. Recently he sat down with Evangelist Susie Shellenberger for this insightful interview.

What were the circumstances in which you gave your life to Christ?

I guess I should start at the beginning . . .

I was born July 26, 1972 in Cincinnati, Ohio to Paul and Anna Ruth Huddleston. I was the younger of two boys, and we were seen as the typical American Christian family. Mom and Dad were from southeast Kentucky and northeast Tennessee. Industry was absent in that part of the country, so needing work they moved 180 miles north to the city. They were hard working, blue-collar people. Because they were in Cincinnati out of necessity, we spent many weekends down home. They worked Monday through Friday and my brother Kenny and I attended school. But, as soon as school was out and the workweek was over, we were in the car heading south.

My grandfather was the pastor of the Wofford, Kentucky Missionary Baptist Church. I always enjoyed attending the services at his church. I can still remember singing the songs out of the redbacked hymnal and listening as my papaw would preach truth-filled sermons. There was something special about those simple childhood days. I was introduced to Jesus at an early age.

When I was 15, I was invited by a girl from my high school to attend a revival service at the Norwood First Church of the Nazarene. I probably would have said no, but this was a girl that I wanted to get to know! And I figured by going to the revival, I'd have that opportunity.

As far as I remember I'd never been to a revival service. It was unlike anything I'd ever experienced! There was a life in these people called Nazarene. The singers sang. The preacher preached. The people responded. It was better than television, so I went back the next night.

By the last service, I realized I needed what these people had. I knew of Jesus – but now I wanted to know Him. I had observed the pattern of the service and at the appropriate time I made my way to the altar to pray. I really didn't know what to expect, but I'll never forget what I experienced.

I remember sensing two big arms wrapping around me. You wouldn't have been able to see them, but I could feel them. It was the arms of the Father. I realized then how much He loved and wanted me. And I needed Him. I've never been the same.

By the way. . . I never got the girl. But I got Jesus. And my life changed.

How did attending ONU help ground you spiritually?

I'm very thankful for my time at Olivet. So many things about those years shaped and prepared me for ministry. Again,

After I was saved

during the revival at Norwood First, I became serious about my relationship with Jesus. Every time there was an opportunity – whether it was youth group, Sunday school, camp meeting, revival, special services, anything – I was in church. I guess you could say that whenever the door was unlocked and the lights were on, I was there. Really, this became my second family.

During my senior year of high school I really began to feel a sense that God wanted me to attend one of our denomination's universities. As I began to seek His direction, it became clear that Olivet was to be that school. In the fall of 1990 I became an Olivetian. It was such an exciting time!

When I first went to Olivet, I planned to become a music teacher. Music had always played such an important part in my life and my music teachers were so special to me that I wanted to have that impact on the lives of others. I had a feeling that God might be calling me into full-time ministry, but I didn't really want to do this. Remember, my papaw was a pastor, so I knew a little about the sacrifice of this calling. So, I made a deal with God: I would declare music education as my major until He made it clear otherwise. It didn't take long. During the spring revival of 1991, God called me into the field of full-time evangelism. I didn't know what that meant; I just knew His voice and direction, so I changed my major.

There are so many things I could say about the education I received while at ONU. I had topnotch training from some of the greatest biblical scholars. I learned the heart for ministry I saw displayed from faculty and staff. I developed relationships that remain even today. It was stressed that I should never settle for mediocrityto always strive to do and give God my best.

"I'll love the Christ you gave first part . . ." is a closing line from the alma mater that we would sing while in Orpheus Choir. And, honestly, that's what was modeled and instilled in me. Christ first. Everything else flows from here. I believe that was the greatest education I received at ONU.

 Before you entered the field of evangelism, you were active in youth ministry. Talk about that experience—and did it help you develop your preaching and evangelistic gifts?

Youth ministry is very special to me. My youth leader, Yvonne Chalfant, and my time in the youth group was so significant that I wanted to facilitate this for others.

While at Olivet, I was able to participate in the spiritual life program of the university. This gave me opportunities to be involved in ministry on many different levels. I was privileged to participate in summer internships and was invited to speak to different youth gatherings. It was definitely a time of preparation!

During my senior year at ONU I was required to complete a field placement for my degree program. To be completely honest, I didn't really want to do it. At this time I was traveling with a southern gospel quartet on weekends and didn't want to give that up. I tried everything to get out of that requirement, but I couldn't. Reluctantly, I headed for the South Lake Church of the Nazarene in Crown Point, Indiana, to serve my time. What I didn't realize was that God had plans for an extended stay.

During my internship God made it very clear that He had placed me at South Lake for a reason. I

really didn't understand, but He made it clear. Through a series of events that would take too much time to explain, His call became clear and at the end of the school year in 1994 I began as a full-time youth pastor at South Lake.

It was both a wonderful and difficult time. Wonderful in the sense that I saw first hand what happened in a group of teens who fell in love with Jesus. Difficult because I was learning what ministry and life was all about.

It's funny you would ask about preaching . . . it was during this time that I began to develop my preaching 'voice' or style. I loved preaching to my youth group on Sunday evenings. It scared me to death, and I would literally become physically sick when I preached to the entire congregation. The people of South Lake and God were so good and patient with me during that time. I will always be thankful God allowed me to learn there with Pastor Ron Richmond. They were some of the greatest days in memory.

Talk a bit about receiving your call to evangelism.

Life doesn't always turn out the way you plan. As I mentioned earlier, I originally felt called into the field of evangelism. It was very real and yet God seemed to lead me down a different path. I didn't understand at the time, but now I can see how He was preparing me for my calling. Had I not worked on staff at a church I, would have had no clue how a church functioned.

I was a youth pastor for just over three years. And, really, I loved it. I was getting opportunities to speak at large youth gatherings, train other youth

workers, and interview for larger ministry positions and



likely could've been comfortable as a youth pastor for quite some time. But, God was beginning to make me uncomfortable.

God brought me back to my original call in 1997. I guess you could say that it was time for me to step into the ministry that He intended. It was a hard year. It was time to do what I was called to do. So, through a series of events God took me back to 1991 when He placed the call on my life. I had to respond. It was time.

 It's sometimes difficult to get started in a specific field. When you entered evangelism, did your calendar simply fill up immediately, or were you directed on a variety of ways to get slated?

One of the songs that I remember singing at my papaw's church was "Living By Faith." That's probably the best way to describe how I entered the field!

When I resigned from the youth pastorate, I really didn't know how God would bless the ministry to which He had called me. All I knew was that He had called. And yet, there were some very real issues. No one knew who I was. I didn't come from a Nazarene family. Everybody was warning that revivalism was dying—a thing of the past. So, where would I begin?

At the close of 1997, I designed a ministry brochure. I knew how people responded to brochures, because I had received many as a youth pastor. But, I didn't know how else to introduce myself. With a stamp and a prayer, I put them in the mail.

Time seemed to crawl by, but in a few weeks the phone started to ring. I can't explain it, but within

a month, God filled my first spring. After a couple of months, my first year was filled. And God has kept it filled! I



don't know how else to explain it than this: God is faithful! I realize that it's nothing I have done – It's all Him. I remember a bookmark that my youth leader Yvonne gave me as a teenager that read; "The will of God will never lead you where the grace of God cannot keep you." It seems so cliché and yet, I have found that to be true.

God has been so faithful. Really, He's been better to me than I could ever possibly deserve. And, I'm thankful.

 You've also enjoyed using your musical gifts in evangelism. Talk about that.

Music has always been an important part of my life. When I was in the fifth grade I remember receiving an invitation to be in the school band. I had always loved music class and singing, but now there was an opportunity to play an instrument. So I jumped at it. I began learning to play the clarinet. (I really wanted to play the trumpet, but the local music store ran out!)

As I entered the eighth grade, I was invited to play percussion in the high school band. I instantly fell in love with field competition and marching band. Besides this, it was such an honor to be included in the high school band when I was in junior high! This is really when my desire to be a music educator began. From my sophomore year on I was playing low brass instruments; baritone, trombone, really wherever there was a need. It was also during this time that I began to become involved in singing—show choir, voice lessons, music theory—music had simply become a large part in my life.

During my time at Olivet, I was a four-year member of the Orpheus Choir. This was a wonderful experience for me. In fact, Olivet would not have been the same for me outside the choir and relationship with its director and my voice teacher, Dr. George Dunbar. His gentle spirit and firm, perfectionist hand really exposed me to a level of excellence that's still an example today.

Having roots in southeast Kentucky, I've always loved bluegrass and southern gospel music. There's something about that type of harmony that thrills me. During my senior year, I was privileged to be the baritone singer for a quartet from Northwest Indiana called The United Quartet. I loved the weekend singing and was seriously considering the pursuit of music as my profession. God's plans were greater.

Today, I'm blessed to be able to both preach and sing. I've had the honor of recording a number of CDs and to even have my music played nationally on southern gospel radio. God has smiled upon my efforts and my singles have been on the Singing News Top 80—even in the Top 40 nationally. Again, it's more than I deserve. God always gives so much more!

I guess I'm trying to say that music has always been an important part of my life. And now, it's a large part of my ministry as well.











What constitutes a successful revival?

Boy, this is a difficult question to answer: Difficult in the sense that people have so many different expectations of what revival even is.

I believe a successful revival is a focused time in/ on the Word, where Jesus is revealed, people respond, and lives are changed. Through the written Word we begin to realize the Living Word among us and are enabled to live and operate in the Resurrected Word's power. That's revival.

What two books have you read that have influenced you spiritually?

I love to read. And, there have been many books along the way that have had a great influence on my life and ministry.

One of my favorite authors is Ken Gire. There's something about his writing style that really speaks to me. When I first began in ministry I ran across his "Moments" series—books he had written about encounters or moments that different individuals had with the Savior. As I read these books—written in their simple, yet engaging style—I was moved. I felt the anguish and loneliness of the leper. I sensed the urgency of the woman making her way to Jesus after a 12-year hemorrhage. I saw the love and acceptance in Jesus' eyes as He looked into theirs. His writing style has influenced the way I read the Bible and has had an impact on my preaching style. Ken Gire is truly a master storyteller.

Currently I'm reading, Walking on Water: Reflections On Faith And Art by Madeleine L'Engle. I've only recently been introduced to her work but it's already having such an impact. There are times when you feel you may be losing your creativity, that you're stuck in a rut. Through L'Engle's words, I'm being reminded that we are all artists who are creating and rediscovering the artistry of the work in which the Master Creator has called and placed me. It's a beautiful book.

· With such a full schedule, how do you stay personally revived?

Anybody in ministry knows the struggle of staying personally revived. It's so important, and yet we get so focused on ministry that we tend to neglect our personal level of spiritual intensity.

Over the years, I have learned that ministry must be focused in the Word. I know that sounds simplistic, but it's true. Whenever I feel empty, it's because I haven't been being filled. If I start to think nothing is happening, or if I develop a bad attitude, it's because I haven't been focused on His word.

I'm learning the necessity of active participation with the written Word. If as a revivalist I am not being filled, I'll have nothing to give. Above all the tools and privileges we have—good books, great biblical preaching, wonderful music—we need to remember, and perhaps rediscover, the power of the Word in our lives. That should be the foundation of any ministry.

Has there been anyone in your past who has helped ground you spiritually and/or professionally?

There have been so many. I'd never be able to mention everyone who has impacted my journey, but here are a few:

- My papaw, Rev. Barton Powers who taught me to serve faithfully without the need of fame or recognition.
- My mom, Anna Ruth Huddleston who showed me what a quiet life of devotion and integrity are all about.
- My pastor and spiritual father, **Rev. Morris Chalfant**, from whom



I learned to conduct myself in a professional, dignified manner in the calling of the ministry.

My youth leader and second mother, Yvonne Chalfant, who always pushed me to strive for something more—to never settle for less and to always realize that it's more than just about me.



Dr. Stephen Manley, who reminded me of the necessity of expositional study and preaching that has fostered a genuine love and hunger for the Word.



Dr. Susie Shellenberger who has helped me find my literary voice and realize a dream of being an author.



There are truly so many who have cared enough to invest in my life. I feel tremendously blessed. I thank God for them all. I hope one day to have impacted another's life in the manner in which they have impacted mine.



A Note from the Editor: Dr. J.K. Warrick shared with me some very enlightening statistics. While conducting a years' worth of district assemblies, he requested pastors to share their testimonies concerning when and where they had been saved and sanctified wholly. The overwhelming majority reported that they had made these crucial decisions during revivals and camp meetings. In the course of this interview, Billy emphasized that he was saved at the age of fifteen in a revival. While at ONU, Billy answered God's call on his life into full-time evangelism during the spring revival. Billy's obedience to God's call to revivalism is impacting those to whom he sings and preaches in revivals and camp meetings.



The Illumination of the Word John 1:1-5

In Him was life; and the life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not." Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." In I Timothy 3:16a, Paul writes, "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh."

J. Paul Taylor, one time Bishop in the Free Methodist church said that "this was not the mystery of darkness but the mystery of light." The topic is the Illumination of the Word, and while Peter's comprehensive term for God was Holy, John's term is Light. The word Light speaks of His purity, glory, brilliance, effulgence, radiance.

We read in Genesis that in the beginning "the earth was without form and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep...and God said, let there be light: and there was light...and God divided the light from the darkness." (Genesis 1: 2 - 4) At the time of creation the world was in a state of chaotic night. Six times it said that God worked from 'evening to morning'. Man works from morning to evening but God always moves from darkness to light.

Following the fall of man in the Garden, once again conditions became chaotic and the darkness was impenetrable. The only ray of light for man was the promise that the seed of the woman would bruise the serpents head. That promise finally came to fruition. "When the fullness of time was come, God sent forth His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, to redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons." (Galatians 4: 4-5) The incarnation of the Word was the fulfillment of that promise. "The Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, And we beheld His glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father full of grace and truth." (John 1:14) This is the mystery and message of the Light, the illumination of the Word.

Without light, the world would be a gloomy dungeon. Darkness produces many ramifications. Depression can be caused by darkness. Insects and vermin spread disease and do their destructive work in the dark.

During WW II, the blackouts in London, England caused rats to multiply and spread disease, and they had to have a day of rat killing to decrease their population. A study of crimes was made of cities of 1000 population or more and the crime rate decreased 43% after they increased the lighting on the streets. "Men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil." (John 3: 19) There is danger in darkness but there is safety in light.

What is most dangerous is the moral darkness that is engulfing our world. The depravity and degradation of man is evident all around us. "For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people." (Isaiah 60:2) It was in this cesspool of moral darkness that the Son of God came to be the 'Light of the world!' In Exodus 33: 18-20 Moses asked God to show him His glory and God said, "thou cannot see my face...no man can see me and live." Jesus came "to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." The reason we could behold Jesus, the Light of the world, was because the glory was veiled in the flesh, even though Peter, James, and John got a glimpse of His glory on the Moun t of Transfiguration.

When one reads the first chapter of Romans, he sees the progression of depravity. "When they knew God, they glorified Him not as God." In fact, "they changed the glory of the uncorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man, and to birds, and four footed beasts, and creeping things." With their bodies degraded, intellect darkened, and emotions depraved "God gave them up." You see the consummation of dark depravity in the last verse of Romans chapter one, "who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them."

Jesus has come and lights every man that comes into the world. This truth was prophesied in Isaiah 49:6 "I will give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation unto the ends of the earth." The sun, which is the center of our solar system, pales in comparison to Him who is the Light of the world. When we come to Him all darkness flees because the darkness cannot put His light out. His is an unchanging and an unconquered light. We have the promise "he that follows me shall not walk in darkness, but shall

have the light of life." (John 20:12) He is the Way the Truth and the Life as well as the Light that illuminates our pathway. "For the path of the just is as the shining light that shineth more and more unto the perfect day." (Proverbs 4:18) When we finally enter into that Celestial city we are told by John the Revelator, "that city will have no need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof." (Revelation 21:23)

"While we have the light" let us be faithful to "walk in the light...so that the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin." (I John 1:7) Jesus said that all who follow Him are 'the light of the world." His exhortation to all who follow Him is "let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5: 16) Let us keep our lamps trimmed and burning with the oil of the Holy Ghost for we are told "they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament, and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever." (Daniel 12:3)

"The whole world was lost in the darkness of sin: *The Light of the world is Jesus.* Like sunshine at noon-day His glory shone in; The Light of the world is Jesus."

"No darkness have we who in Jesus abide; The Liaht of the world is Jesus. We walk in the Light when we follow our Guide; The Light of the world is Jesus."

"No need of the sunlight in heaven we're told; *The Light of the world is Jesus.* The Lamb is the Light in the city of gold; The Light of the world is Jesus."

"Come to the Light; tis shining for thee. Sweetly the Light has dawned upon me. Once I was blind, but now I can see. The Light of the world is Jesus."
