After My Campers Arrive

<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I told them about the camp traditions and customs?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I discussed general camp rules and policies?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I made each camper feel welcome?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I asked my campers what they would like to accomplish in camp?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I been alert on this first day of camp to any signs of homesickness?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I found something that each of my campers can do well?
<input type="checkbox"/>	Have I stressed courtesy and consideration for one another?
