

FROM THE EDITOR

Beth and I are blessed when our children share their fond memories of the people, pastors, and churches we ministered in over the years.

My oldest daughter, Julie, spent over a year in Baghdad during the height of the war in Iraq. One day during a conversation using "Skype," I asked her if she felt safe in the "Green Zone." She thought for a moment and said, "Sissy and I never felt so safe as when we went to those churches where everybody prayed out loud at the same time on their knees. We felt like nothing could hurt us there."

In a day when so many unchurched children face fear and uncertainty, the church needs to use every means possible to reach them with the good news of a loving Savior and Protector. Let's do our very best to support and encourage those God has called and gifted to minister to them. I believe the Raeburns and other evangelists like them are being used of the Lord to be Jesus to the children of this day and age.

The Gosped with a Twist

STEVE & JANET RAEBURN

Evangelists and large balloon sculptures—not necessarily two things you think of together, but for Revs. Steve and Janet Raeburn and our family (known as Big Blast Ministries), they do! Here are the facts.....

One hundred and forty-four million adults and forty-two million children and teenagers do not attend a church according to the Barna Group (December 10, 2014). That means two out of every three children in the United States do NOT go to church. Eighty-five percent of Christians come to know the Lord before the age of thirteen. These facts can be very discouraging. The Church wants to do something to reach the lost, but in many cases it suffers "outreach insanity" by doing the same things over and over to reach people, but expecting different results.

Big Blast Ministries is changing the method – but NOT the message! I guess you could say, we are putting a new "twist" on the gospel and the holiness message. My wife and I grew up 1,500 miles apart and yet God had a plan to form us into a team who, together with our children, help reach the lost. Only God could have looked and seen us as "family and children's evangelists!"

Steve's Story

I grew up in Britton, Michigan. My family attended a local church, but after a church split, we found ourselves floundering between churches. At school one day, during recess, the popular kids asked me if I cussed. With the inward desire to fit in with the popular group, I said yes, even though it was not true. I didn't see that as the moment of accountability, but what came next was the decisive moment. The "popular" kids wanted proof. I knew what God expected me to do and what He didn't want me to do. I knew what was right and what was wrong. I'm sorry to say I chose wrong. That was just the first step. I continued to walk away, choosing wrong over right. I was a good actor, so I fooled a lot of people, including my parents. All throughout middle school and high school I continued to walk away from the Lord.

During high school, I continued to make poor choices, but something happened that God used to plant seeds in my life. I was very athletic, playing football and basketball for

my high school, but during the summer there was not a lot happening. A friend of mine, Steve Bearinger, asked me if I wanted to play softball for his church, Ridgeway Church of the Nazarene in Ridgeway, Michigan. There was one condition: you had to attend church twice a month in order to play. I thought that wasn't so bad, so I said yes. My first Sunday was a little different than what I was used to because during the message someone shouted "Amen!" That was guite a surprise for me. The pastor at the time was Rev. Donald Ault. He didn't pull any punches, but gave each point in a loving way and God used him. The people at the church were very friendly and I started attending more often, and so did my parents. For three years, even though I attended church, there wasn't a true commitment to God. I acted like a Christian and people would have said I was a good boy. I was just good at fooling people, but God had a plan to get my attention. The summer between my freshman and sophomore year at college, a couple of friends and I were in a terrible car accident. It was one of those times where you wake up in the hospital and have no idea how you got there. A few weeks later, I received a bill from the ambulance company. On that bill, one of the categories was "Advanced Life Support." God spoke to me and said, "If you would have died, you wouldn't have gone to heaven, but to hell." Why? Because I wasn't a real Christian, I was a fake and I knew He was right. It was that moment when I truly asked Jesus to forgive me of my sins. After attending a state university for another year, I knew it wasn't for me and God led me to Olivet Nazarene College.

Janet's Story

My grandparents had given land, time, and talents to help start one of the first Nazarene

churches in Saskatchewan, Canada – long before I was even born. I grew up in the Nazarene church and every time the doors were open, we were there. When I was seven years old, I went to camp for the first time. At chapel one night, a fuzzy green puppet talked about how Jesus died for me - for my sins. I'd heard that Jesus loved me all my life and I knew He had died for the world's sins, but for the first time in my life, it hit me – Jesus died for me! As soon as the invitation to come forward and pray was given I was up front and kneeling at the altar. I think my beautiful prayer was just, "Jesus, please forgive me. Please forgive me. Please forgive me!" I was sincere. I wanted to be changed. I remember standing up and feeling different - clean, at peace, content. I was too young to put it into words then, but I knew beyond a shadow of a doubt something was different. God had changed me.

I continued to follow God through my childhood and teen years. I used to think that this was the most boring testimony ever! Now I realize – it's the most exciting one! The fact that God can save you at an early age and then keep you close is an incredible thing to share with children, to let them know it's possible, to let them see that with God's help I made good choices and they can, too. So when it was time to choose a college, I wanted a Christian one. At the time, I believed God wanted me in radio, so I started looking for a good college with a communications/broadcasting major and one that came with some practical experience. I searched all over Canada and couldn't find anything. Then, thanks to our pastor's daughter, Patty (Davidson) Johnson, she told me about Olivet Nazarene University. It was exactly what I was looking for, even though it was very, very far away from home.

We Met at Olivet Nazarene University

During our time at Olivet, neither of us felt a call to ministry. I was a history education major and Janet was a communications major. Janet had even said she would never marry a pastor! Little did we know what God had planned.

Married in July 1988

We started attending Adrian First Church of the Nazarene and soon became involved in ministry, first with the teens and then with children. The church asked Janet to teach a pre-school Sunday school class, and the only way she would do that was if I would do it with her. It was one of the first steps in the preparation of our calling.

When we first started teaching, we found that Sunday school/children's lessons hadn't changed much over the years. "Jesus Loves Me" is a great song, but we figured there had to be something new and different that was good as well. So we started looking for things that made church fun. Steve saw a book in the store on how to make balloon animals and thought it could help. So he went home and started twisting balloons. Soon after that, God placed the Fellowship of Christian Magicians (FCM) in our lives – another step



in our preparation. The FCM was having a conference in town and we decided to go. We saw all these GREAT, exciting ways to share the gospel. We learned about balloon twisting, illusions, puppets, story telling, clowning, and music. At the time, we were just trying to make our own church exciting and meaningful. We look back now and see how God was preparing us for our ministry today.

A Move and a Calling

In April of 1996 we moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan because it was closer to our jobs. In July of that year, our oldest, David, was born, followed in 1998 by another son Adam. We found a local Nazarene church and continued to be involved in children's ministry. The year 2000 was an important year in our lives. Janet's dad was diagnosed with cancer. It was terminal and she flew home to be with her family. It was during that time our church, Honey Creek Church of the Nazarene, had a revival. Because of revival and because of Janet's dad passing away, I spent a lot of time in prayer. I was telling God how I wanted to be like my father-in-law. He had a great family and they were all Christians and that's what I wanted for my family. In revival that night, the speaker spoke on sanctification. God told me if I wanted what my father-in-law had, I needed to surrender everything to Him. So I did. It was that night in April 2000 when I was sanctified and called to be an evangelist. You can imagine the conversation I had with Janet when I called and told her! Janet was watching her dad die while I was telling her God wanted to completely change our lives. I knew I had to do this so I started taking classes to become an ordained elder.



It wasn't until March of 2003 that Janet accepted the call to ministry. She says, "It was three long, hard years. I knew God wanted me to be an evangelist, but I didn't want to change my life. We had two small boys - I couldn't do that to them! I had a job I loved - I didn't want to give that up! I was on the praise team at church, on the church board, teaching Sunday School classes and the VBS director where lots and lots of children were being saved and families were coming to church, but I wasn't doing what God wanted me to be doing – and I was miserable. During another revival at our church (see how important that is?) and with more fasting and prayer, God spoke to me and told me I needed to do what He wanted me to do or never say I loved Him again! He was serious. I finally said yes - and started taking classes with Steve to become ordained."

A Ministry and a Child is Born

In 2004 we quit our jobs and went into fulltime ministry. It was a very scary thing. We lost 75% of our income and really didn't know exactly what to do or how to do it. We just trusted God would help us – and He did. One of the first Vacation Bible Schools we conducted was in Morenci, Michigan, where we met Larry and Tamla Leckrone. The Leckrones were so helpful and supportive. What to do next, who to contact, and some good advice was what the Raeburns needed right then. It was great to see someone who had told God "yes" to being an evangelist and God was taking care of them." They encouraged us to attend the Evangelists' Gathering, held at that time, in Shipshewana, Indiana. I am so glad we went. One lady, I don't even remember who she was, came up to us at the gathering and talked to us a bit. She shared how when they first started out they thought their children weren't good enough to be on the platform with them, how their kids just sat through all those services with them, how now their kids are all adults and now none of them even attend church. It was another step in our preparation. We decided then our children would be part of the ministry.

We started looking for things for our boys to do. First, little things like running the sound board or bringing a balloon sculpture on stage or taking pictures, but they kept on wanting to do more. Then in 2006, God put a BIG surprise



into their lives. Janet became pregnant and our daughter Kathryn was born. Our insurance didn't cover pregnancies. We had given all our baby things away years ago as the boys were now eight and ten years old. God moved in miraculous ways and provided everything we needed, right down to being able to see the

same doctor who delivered our boys. Our Whole Family is a BIG Part of Our Ministry

Today David is 18 and a senior in high school. He plans on attending Olivet Nazarene University this fall with a major in mass media (video and film editing). The ministry will miss his skills behind the computer and the sound board. Adam is 16 and a junior in high school. His talents are balloon twisting and animating



the puppet, "Feathers." Kathryn is now eight and in second grade. She is still figuring out what she will add to the ministry – possibly balloon twisting, maybe chalk art, maybe puppets. Until then she helps with the memory verses and leads singing. She is a good example for the other children her age.

Today, we are both tenured evangelists in the Church of the Nazarene. We have ministered in twenty-six states, two provinces in Canada, and at an orphanage in Honduras in the last ten years. We are serious about what we do, but we have a whole lot of fun doing it! Church needs to be fun. We need to enjoy our faith. The wonderful fact is when we do that, the Holy Spirit moves in and speaks to people. When we first started out, we knew God wanted us to preach to children. What we didn't think about was that the Gospel is the same for children as it is for adults. I was reminded of that when teens and adults started responding to altar calls during our services. Steve remembers one of the first times we did a "family service." During the invitation a man stood up and started working his way down the aisle. I was thinking, "Sir, you picked the wrong time to use the restroom," but that man was the first one to come to the altar. In fact, no children at all responded that day, only about eight adults. God used that service to remind us His message is truly for everyone – and the simple exciting method He has given us was for more than children.

The Raeburns, or Big Blast Ministries, tell people all the time it's okay to smile in church. We use large balloon sculptures and illusions (magic) to share what God has laid on our hearts. Our large balloon sculptures are our niche or our "twist" in the evangelism world. Everyone loves the large balloon sculptures Steve and Adam create. It adds something to the Bible stories Janet shares. It brings the stories to life and keeps the crowd's attention. We also use illusions for object lessons during our services. We are very clear we do



"tricks." We have NO special powers. The illusions combined with videos that David creates, keep children of all ages wanting more because they enjoy it tremendously. We try our best to make it entertaining, but we try harder to make sure that the audience still hears the truth of God's word. While they are having fun, people often lower their guard and that's when the Holy Spirit moves in and speaks to them. Because of the unique way we share this message, many people call us children's evangelists, and that's okay because we are all children of God. The gospel doesn't change just because we are young or old. It's the same gospel for an eight-year-old as it is for an 88-year-old. It doesn't change. We preach the same messages as other evangelists; we just do it a little differently than everyone else. We do more than Vacation Bible Schools, children's revivals, and camps. Churches like to bring us in for family revivals because we are different than other evangelists. They can invite someone who doesn't go to church to come see the balloon guy or the magician, but reassured they will still hear the good news and the holiness message.

God is the God of Possible

God took two very different people from two different countries with two different testimonies and two different backgrounds and brought them together. Although neither one of us was studying for ministry or even considering it, He called us to reach out to people with no church background at all. We are amazed and humbled that God continues to use our family to reach children – of ALL ages – for Jesus Christ. We continue to try to listen closely to God to see what's next.

For others, it will be the time when they totally surrendered and were sanctified. Others have been called to full-time Christian service as they see themselves doing what is modeled before them. We know firsthand how thrilling it is to watch the excited eyes and open mind of a child learn about Jesus. Only eternity will reveal the trophies of grace that were snatched from the snares of the wicked one when the mind of a child, young or old, says "Yes" to God's will for their life.

To paraphrase the words of recently departed song writer, Andraé Crouch,

Steve and Janet have had many tears and sorrows; They've had questions for tomorrow... But in every situation, they've found blessed consolation That their trials come to only make them strong! Through it all... they've learned to depend upon God's Word!

ccording to his Coast Guard biography, "Vice Admiral William "Dean" Lee assumed the duties as Commander, Coast Guard Atlantic Area (LANTAREA) in May of 2014, where he serves as the operational commander for all U.S. Coast Guard missions from the Rocky Mountains to the Arabian Gulf, spanning across five Coast Guard Districts and 40 states. He concurrently serves as Commander, Defense Force East and provides Coast Guard mission support to the Department of Defense and Combatant Commanders." Vice Admiral William "Dean" Lee is obviously a highly trained and experienced military leader. I am certain that many examples of moral courage and integrity could be offered on his behalf. In 2013, he stood before the audience at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington D. C. He put aside his prepared speech and spoke from his heart. In his remarks, he mentioned the great need of spiritual guidance and emotional healing among



our military personnel. He spoke of the often urgent need to help a fellow man or woman in uniform. A great leader depends on those under his command to do their respective jobs and to do them well. Although he acknowledged he was not a chaplain, he was extremely supportive of those called to this area of service.

According to Lee, "every sixty-five minutes a veteran who has served his country commits suicide." Upon meeting a man who attempted suicide, but survived, Rear Admiral Lee told the audience, "...there's not enough chaplains to go around." Furthermore, "the rules say— send him to the chaplain. My heart said— give this man a Bible." Near the end of his remarks, he boldly proclaimed, "I'm telling you that I am coming out today to tell you I am not going to run from my religious freedoms, from my right under the constitution to tell a young man that there is hope." (standing ovation)



It is important to note that instead of being disciplined for his opposition to official policy concerning religious expression, he was promoted in May of 2014 to the higher rank of vice admiral. 



After six years of full-time ministry on the Kansas City District, I was looking forward to M15 and expecting to recognize many of those attending the conference in February of 2015.

One day, as I was walking out of the convention center, I saw a face that instantly sent me BACK. Do you know what I mean? You see someone you haven't seen in years, and when you do, you are instantly in the spot where you first saw them.

I was eight years old, sitting in a church pew, when I first saw Norman. For the first time in a long time, I really wanted to go to church that night. I was a fidgety and curious child and sometimes long services in a big church became "cruel and unusual punishment." We were having a revival. I mustered up my courage as I jaywalked across the street to catch up with this storyteller I remembered from my childhood. As I tapped his shoulder I realized I could not remember his name. I said, "Hi my name is Pastor Shawna, I am a children's pastor and I tell stories the way I do because of you..."

Norman didn't care that I didn't remember his

name. He did not care because he understands the meaning and purpose of evangelism. I grasped the message he proclaimed even as an elementary school kid. His message not only captivated an eight-year-old's imagination, but instilled a love for the story – the cornerstone for my philosophy of ministry. Thank you evangelists for influencing more people than you know – even silly ones that take twenty years to realize you have done so.

FIRST REVIVAL

I walked through the front door of Salem Community Church of the Nazarene in Fredericksburg, Virginia, and was greeted immediately by Pastors Buddy and Gaye Marston. Their smiles and welcoming spirits calmed my apprehension. The foyer of the church is larger than most sanctuaries where I have been privileged to minister!

When I am invited to a church for revival services where I have never been, the question "bounces" around in my brain, "Why did these people I don't know call me to preach at "their" church?" So, I asked them, "Why did you call me to your church?" Gaye Marston then told me about a revival she attended at

the Church of the Nazarene in Harrisonburg, Virginia in 1980, and during that revival she was sanctified. She said, "You were the evangelist!"

Buddy and Gaye proceeded to tell me they had never scheduled a revival at their church and wanted me to come for their "First Revival" which coincided with their ministry theme for the year 2015, "First" based on Matthew 6:33, "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God...!"

The revival began on Saturday night, would include two Sunday morning services and services Monday through Wednesday. Pastor Marston told me I preached to approximately 1300 in the first three services. In almost 28 years of revival ministry, I don't think I have ever experienced what happened in those six services. Typically, the church has three identical services, Saturday night and two on Sunday morning. The first night of the revival, people were told each service and sermon would be different. Many who normally came on Saturday night only, returned Sunday morning. Some of those stayed for the second service. Young people would come and lay out their jackets and Bibles to reserve seats on the second row. It was obvious. The people "owned" the meeting. God came and lives were changed.

This "First Revival" will have a lasting effect upon me. What an honor to be a part of this wonderful move of God at Salem Community Church of the Nazarene.

On the final night, Pastor Buddy Marston asked the people to record on paper what the "First Revival" had meant to them. Those cards were presented to me. The following is a sampling of what was shared as an encouragement to me.

"This has been one of the greatest revivals that I have attended. My spirit was fed at a level that left me speechless." (Randi) "I've never been to a revival before that I couldn't wait to come back the next night. It was a blessing to be bathed in the Holy Spirit." (A sister in Christ)

"I knelt at the altar for the first time and my friend found Christ." (Lauryn)

"I came here hurting. In the deepest valley I have been in life. I've lied, cheated, killed, cursed God... I've never had a spiritual experience until tonight. I know God's grace and His Spirit has me now...my life won't ever be the same. (Sgt. Roy S. USMC)

"This was my first revival, and what an awesome experience." (Unsigned)

"I have four teenagers...this is the first revival they've ever attended. Each of them has heard something they needed to hear..." (Jennifer)

"It (the revival) was beyond all that we hoped and prayed for..." (Pastor Buddy Marston)

One of my favorite songs which I think really sets the stage for revival and evangelistic preaching is "Word of God Speak." My fellow evangelist and good friend Marcus Whitworth does this song as well as anyone. Not long ago, someone asked me this very loaded question: "Are you still seeing miracles in your meetings from week-to-week and are people still being saved, sanctified, healed and delivered, and are churches really being revived?" It gave me reason to pause and reflect just on my revival meetings this calendar year. I know for a fact God revived and renewed the Nouvelle Church of the Nazarene (Nouvelle is new in French Cajun country) in Lafayette, Louisiana, at the beginning of this year. Pastor Dale Hoffpauir planted this church just three years ago and they have already crossed the 100 barrier in attendance and are headed towards 200. This was my second revival for this "baby" church (remember they have only been in existence for three years), and Pastor Dale has already scheduled another meeting. Pastor Dale firmly believes the fires of revival have been part of his church's spiritual and numerical growth. Yes...the WORD of God still speaks!

I held a revival in East Liverpool, Ohio, a couple of weeks later. There were winter storm warnings, and the Sunday morning service was right in the middle of blizzard conditions. We would not have had church in Georgia. At the end of my message I gave an invitation and Andy responded and was gloriously saved. A 34-year old man who thought sin and addictive behaviors had ruined his life found that God's WORD still speaks and gave him a brand new beginning.

At First Church of the Nazarene in Kingman, Arizona, I anointed and prayed the prayer of faith over Tom, who could not use his legs without assistance. The WORD of God touched Tom and he walked of his own accord out of that service and didn't miss another night of the revival....testifying in faith believing and claiming his healing.

Just last night in Greensboro, North Carolina, 18 churches came together and the WORD of God spoke in a powerful way. Hundreds responded to the altar calls! People were saved, sanctified, and delivered. One couple testified openly that God had saved and restored their marriage.

So the answer to the question is YES! Miracles are still happening and people are still being saved. The church is still being revived. WORD

WHERE THE GOSPEL EXCELS

These days I find myself doing more front-line evangelistic work than ever before. And I have found a methodology better than street preaching.

I have preached in dozens of bike rallies and biker Sundays. It is part of my work serving as the National Evangelist for the Priesthood Motorcycle Ministry, a network of 400+ members in chapters in 15 states.

I travel to bike rallies with a portable shoe shine stand I designed and had custom made for this ministry. It used to be I would set up a table and hand out New Testaments. But most who would pass by would say they already had a Bible and move on. Now I give away free boot shines. No money changes hands; it's just free.

"Why are you doing this?" they ask.

"I just want to do something nice for people with no strings attached."

Of course, this gets them in the chair for about 12 or 15 minutes. And now I have time to talk with them. While I am working on their boots I begin a conversation that might turn from work, to family, to who knows what. I get to learn what they do for a living and if they like their jobs. I find out about their family and if their parents are well or sick. It is just a general conversation that is dependent on their willingness to make small talk with me while I'm working on their boots.

Recently I met Dave at a rally in Natchitoches, Louisiana. Dave worked on an oil platform in the Gulf of Mexico. Hard, dangerous work to be sure. He told me his work pattern was six weeks out, three weeks home. He and his wife and 5-year-old son, Zack, were enjoying his last weekend before going back to the platform.

When I finished with his boots, he inquired about what he owed me.

"Nothing," I said.

"I want to give you something."

"No, it's free. Remember?"

"Well, are you raising money for something? I can help with that."

"No, I'm not raising money for anything."

By now Dave was sufficiently perplexed at the freebee.

"If you would," I said, "I'll call it even if you would let me pray for you." Few people refuse prayer. "Can I touch you?" I asked.

"Sure," he replied.

And so, with Dave still on the shoe shine stool and my hands on his shoulders, I begin to pray (proclaim) the truth of God into his hearing. I prayed God would keep him safe while on the oil platform, but I also prayed God would help him live on the platform in a manner in which he doesn't have to keep secrets from his wife when he comes home. I prayed for Dave and his young son, that Dave will be the kind of father Zack needs to help him grow up to become a fine young man. I prayed his wife would not become discouraged at his absence and they would continue to honor their vows to each other.

This is where the gospel excels. A great Scottish preacher once said, "Through the risen Christ there has been let loose into the world a force which can transform life beyond recognition." Anywhere the work of the gospel is being conducted, the potential for transformation is present. And it is present in full intensity and strength. "The gospel is the power of God."

I have no other place where I can meet total strangers, spend 12-15 minutes in "investigative dialogue," ask for permission to pray about something in their lives, and "pray" the truth of God into their hearing. If I had stood on the corner preaching on the important topic of being a husband and father, most likely he would have kept walking. But on my shoe shine stand, his ears were no further from me than

the length of my arms, and I prayed the truth of God in his ears."

And I even held him down while I preached. Awesome!

The Church of the Nazarene was born in the spirit of revival. My introduction to the Nazarene church was through a revival, where God called me to preach in the spring of 1979 under the ministry of evangelist Wayne Rose. In the spring of 1981, God sanctified my heart in a revival at Southern Nazarene University under the preaching of Dr. Jim Bond. In my 34 years of ministry, it's been amazing to see God at work through revivals and camp meetings led by the greatest evangelists to be found anywhere.

I have scheduled two revivals per year in the churches I have pastored. People are saved. Christians are sanctified. Homes are restored. Saints are built up in the faith and the morale of the church is lifted. I am always refreshed and strengthened as a pastor (I NEED REVIVAL). It's an amazing thing to experience.

I'm blessed to serve on the ministries board of our district where each year we hear the testimony of men and women called to preach. Their stories reach back to a revival or camp meeting where an evangelist was used by the Lord to speak His call into their hearts.

My best friend in the ministry, Dr. Paul Whiteford, says, "Revival is in the DNA of the Church of the Nazarene. It affords us the opportunity to hear a fresh voice in the pulpit and allows the Lord to speak new Truth to His people." Paul and I were surrounded in Bethany, Oklahoma by numerous Nazarene churches which hosted amazing evangelists through the years. That atmosphere has blessed us both greatly in our ministries.

The face of ministry is rapidly changing. Methods are all over the map. There are as many approaches to preaching and leading a church as there are churches. However, I see revival with the God-called evangelist as timeless as God Himself. The power and passion of the presentation of God's Word is needed more than ever. Revival is the tool God has given us to make this happen.

Seed thought for future discussion: Wouldn't it be amazing if we could integrate revival in the church-planting model? What if revival were an active ingredient in the new wine of the new wine skin of starting churches? I believe it's possible. I believe it's vital!

"Practical Holiness"

The phrase "in Christ" is an expression the Apostle Paul often uses in his Epistles. To be "in Christ" is to be reconciled to God. He is a "new creature: old things are passed away; behold all things are become new." (II Corinthians 5:17) Such a one has turned from darkness to light and is walking in a new direction. He has entered into the kingdom of God and living in a new dominion. He is no longer governed by the flesh but by the Spirit who is the new dynamic in his life. His primary objective is to live his life pleasing Him who went to the cross to make salvation possible. He is pressing onward and upward following new directives from God.

There is something in the heart of one newly converted to Christ which always aspires upward. His desire is to be pleasing to the one to whom he owes his new found life. He acknowledges that God is "light and in Him is no darkness at all," (I John 1:5) and that He is holy to the exclusion of all that is unholy. Along with that acknowledgement, he realizes in order for there to be fellowship between him and his Savior, some things must be held in common. Light cannot fellowship with darkness and holiness will not tolerate sin. As he walks with God in sweet communion he soon is made aware of an inward condition that militates against and conflicts with the fellowship he enjoys with "the holy one of Israel." It is an indication that he needs a more advanced experience of grace.

The call to a deeper experience of grace is taught throughout the New Testament. The unnamed writer of Hebrews teaches that the proof of the Father's love for His children is that he chastens them so they "might be partakers of his holiness." There is only one kind of chastening "whereof all (believers) are partakers," which proves a man is truly born of God, and the absence of such chastening proves his profession of the new birth invalid. This "chastening of the Lord" administered to the child of God is to impel him on to the experience of holiness. At first this "chastening will not seem joyous, but grievous: afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness." Notice this experience comes only to those who are responsive to His chastening, unto them which are exercised thereby." It also states this chastening is 'for a few days." God expects obedience of His children because delayed obedience is disobedience. The inference is that God will finally cease to urge us on when the Christian shows no interest in the matter. The admonition is given to "follow (translated, persecute, pursue with deliberation) holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." (Hebrews 12: 5-14)

There are two extremes we often face when proclaiming the message of holiness. There are those who would say the standard of holiness held up in scripture is too high and declare it impossible to attain. They would say the law is God's straight edge which He intended us to stand alongside to measure how crooked we were. They say the purpose of the commandments of God was not for us to keep them, but just to incite us to aim higher in our living. They advocate an everlasting pursuit without any possibility of possession. Such teaching diminishes the efficacy of the cross and makes the Gospel powerless in its proclamation. With every requirement God gives to His children, there is sufficiency of grace to meet that requirement.

The other extreme is to proclaim such a rigid standard of living and declare anyone who does not meet such a standard cannot truly be a Christian. They represent a standard which would determinedly exclude many God includes. This kind of teaching is certainly not inviting and tends to drive people farther away from Christ. If our image of holiness is harsh, bigoted, and critical, it will produce distortion in the belief, and consequently, in the practice of its adherents. True holiness always manifests itself in love and love always seeks to bring its object to holiness. True holiness is an experience of the heart which is validated by the ethics of one's life. It is a doctrine to be believed, an experience to be received, and a life to be lived. It is the life lived which is most important to the world.

The basic idea of holiness is that our whole being is to be made complete in love. Jesus said, "By this shall all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love one to another." (John 13:35) Love is the product of a pure heart. To maintain this love requires great diligence and discipline. Let me quote from the writings of G. D. Watson.

"Love is like a flame or volatile fluid and it needs constant feeding. Doctrine, like a piece of wood, is solid and static in its form and is the same year after year. One may have the doctrine of holiness fixed as an unchanging truth in the mind but the quivering flame of love in the heart is guite different. A person through neglect can allow love leak out of their heart all the while maintaining a well-defined doctrine of Biblical holiness in their mind. It is easier to retain a certain truth fixed in the mind than to retain a fixedness in one's affection. If, through neglect, we fail to keep the glow and warmth of the flame of love in our heart the sweetness and beauty of holiness will become sour and ugly. It will take an immense amount of love to keep the gentleness and charity of the heart up equal to the sharp discernment of the mind. Wesley observed that great light upon religious matters without great love is very dangerous." 1

The world at large does not read the Word of God. They care very little what the Bible teaches concerning the doctrine of holiness. Therefore it will take more than sound doctrine in our minds and genuine experience in our hearts to reach a lost world. It is the ethics of a holy life that speaks loudest to the world around us. It is in the realm of love that we either prove or disprove the doctrine and experience of holiness to those we seek to win to Christ. Let us be "in Christ' and allow His love to work "in and through" us. If we fail to do so, we can become the greatest obstacle to the advancement of God's call to holiness.


