AN UNCERTAIN ENCOUNTER

Judges 6:11-23, 36-40

Judges 6:22 "When Gideon realized that is was an angel of the Lord, he exclaimed, "Ah, Sovereign Lord! I have seen the angel of the Lord face to face!"

Purpose: To fortify our faith.

Proposition: God reassures His people.

Introduction:

#Video clip from <u>The Apostle</u> when the character does not hear from God, he asks for a sign.

- 1. In human experience we have questioned God's presence and approval.
 - #Am I imagining God? Is He directing me or is this merely what I want? If something is what I want then more than likely I think God does not want it.
- 2. Gideon was the doubting Thomas of the Old Testament.
- 3. Let's recount God's ministry to a fearful and questioning person:
- I. "Why has all this happened?" (13).
 - A. When the Lord's angel said, "You are a courageous person," Gideon responded with the inquiry, "Then why are things happening to us?"
 - 1. Israel is cycling from faith to defection.
 - 2. Israel's sin is the reason God allows the Midianites to invade Israel.
 - 3. Israel began to worship idols.
 - 4. The Midianites ravage the crops from Israel.
 - 5. Gideon sees God's favor has been withdrawn.

- B. "The Lord is with you" (12).
 - 1. Gideon questions; he presents present doubt.
 - 2. Gideon recounts how God used to help.
 - 3. Gideon concludes God has abandoned Israel (13).

II. "I am not worthy or capable."

- A. God reissued His call.
 - 1. Gideon protests, "How can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest and I am the least of my family"(15).
 - 2. Gideon's doubts expanded focusing on his inadequacy and weaknesses.
 - 3. God says, Go in the strength you have" (14).
 - 4. "Am I not sending you?" (14).
- B. God reassured yet again, "I will be with you" (16).
 - 1. You will strike down the enemy (16).
 - 2. Gideon possessed an insatiable need for reassurance.
 - 3. God affirmed His solidarity and union with Gideon.

III. "I need a sign."

- A. God gives Gideon a sign upon request.
 - 1. God caused fire to ignite Gideon's sacrifice.
 - 2. Fire flaring out of a rock would have been enough to convince most of us.
 - 3. God goes to some effort to confirm His call upon our lives.
- B. "I'm going to die"
 - 1. Realizing he had seen the messenger of the Lord, he thought he was going to die.
 - 2. God put him at ease, "Peace! Do not be afraid. You are not going to die." (23)
 - 3. Because of close contact with God others such as Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel thought they were going to be killed.

- IV. "If you will save Israel by my hand as you have promised . . . " (36).
 - A. God once more reassures Gideon.
 - 1. God makes the sheepskin wet and the grass dry.
 - 2. Gideon wrings the water out of the fleece.
 - 3. We would think this is sufficient evidence, but not Gideon.
 - 4. He asks for the fleece to be dry and the ground wet.
 - B. God accommodated Gideon's uncertainty.

Conclusion:

- 1. Gideon required a reinforced faith.
- 2. The physical realm can open the eyes to the spiritual.
- 3. In verse 34, "The Spirit of the Lord came upon Gideon." #Literally, "The Spirit of the Lord put on Gideon" like a garment.
- 4. God today wants to wrap Himself with your body.
- 5. He wishes to live in you and to work through you.
- 6. Let's invite Him in, even amid our doubts.
