aul in Romans 1:16, tells us that the Gospel is the power of God

unto salvation to everyone who believes. We further know that the word "Gospel" means, "Good News." Good news, however, is only good news as it is measured against the desperate need of one's situation. For example, if you get a physical check-up for the detection of cancer and the test results are fine, that is good news. However if you have been taking treatments for the disease and then get a physical check-up and are told you no longer have cancer, that is good news indeed.

No man is interested in a piece of good news unless he has the consciousness of needing it; no man is interested in an offer of salvation unless he knows that there is something from which he needs to be saved. Therein lies the burden of the sinner, which comes by the prevenient grace of God through faithful preaching of the preacher and faithful praying, living and witness of all Christians.

The burden of the preacher, however, must call attention to the divine imminence and to His displeasure with sin. The church cannot merely sing, shout, or preach its way into a divine visitation. It cannot even pray its way into such a visitation except there be a sufficient concern for the need of such prayers. We as preachers of His word must first have a vision and understanding of the human need along with the magnitude of the divine promise. It is only then that we can pray intelligently and preach aggressively under His anointing and expect a divine visitation with Pentecostal results.

Resurrection

esurrection is the reality of the power of Christ flowing through a life having aone all the way to the 'Price of the Cross' with the old man being crucified and the body of sin destroyed. (ROM. 6:6)

In II Cor. 4:10, Paul declares "Always carrying about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body." Only the dead can be resurrected. Only those who have died to sin can live in resurrection power.

There is the awesome possibility that having been resurrected, we can again die in an act of sin. David, identified as a man after God's own heart, after he became King of all Israel slipped into a position of vulnerability to temptation and sin. (IlSamuel 11) Psalms 51 is his prayer of repentance. He cries out for a clean heart (v. 10), the reality of God's presence (v. 11) and restoration. "Restore to me the joy of Your salvation" (v. 12) Something once had, then lost, can be restored. David was seeking the restoration of resurrection power.

The subtle inroad of the influences of our culture, the decline in maintaining with vigilance a close communion with God can begin to move a heart away from the flow of resurrection power through a pure heart. Revival is "wakeup" time to bring us to spiritual alertness, to reveal the heart that is not dead to sin and to restore those who have fallen. Resurrection power is God's plan through Christ. Let revival restoration be a reality in our lives today.

hear many suggest that the day of revival is past or at best a waste of time in our modern age. I fear this is due to a vast ignorance of the true nature of revival. The idea seems to be that the right speaker with the right program will result in a great increase in numbers. After all the god of success is numbers. However, that is not the true purpose of revival. I believe it's true purpose is found in understanding the "Solemn Assembly" of the Old Testament.

"Solemn Assembly" may be new to many professing Christians but not to God's people. There were at least twelve times where God called His people to "Solemn NONSENSE Assembly." Each of these were preceded by some form of righteous judgment from God. The standard form of that judgment consisted of the withdrawal of the evidence of His manifest presence and merciful favors. The result was an immediate and extensive increase of wickedness. As soon as this became evident, spiritually sensitive leaders did not foolishly point their fingers at the unbelieving world. They knew that God's righteous judgment was not against the world but His own people. They knew that this was God's signal to call His people to "Solemn Assembly". It was a time for His people to repent, refocus and remember who they were and whose they were. They were not just ordinary people, they were to be God's witness to all the other nations of the reality of God. By the way, we must never forget that is why the church is here. In fact it is our only business.

was characterized by the following:

- 1. All normal daily work was set aside. Num. 29:35, Deut. 6:8
- 2. All God's people were required to be there. Joel 2:16

3. It was to be a sacrifice of time. Num. 10:10 Our most valued possession is time. What sacrifice could be more important than the sacrifice of time in order to participate fully in reversing God's righteous judgment against his people?

4. It usually involved a time of protracted duration. While many professed Christians seem content with hour-long "worship" services, the call to "Solemn Assembly" is a call to a greater commitment of time.

- 5. It was a time of earnest prayer comprised of two parts: a time to present our requests to God, but more important, a time for God to present His requirements to us.
 - 6. Most important was the awareness that it was God who was doing the examination not man. When we try to be the examiner we tend to be easy on ourselves. But God who knows the heart must be the final witness. His Word not ours is the instrument by which we are measured.

God's response to these times of spiritual renewal was to send fresh waves of blessing into both the personal and corporate lives of His people. That is the true nature and purpose of revival for our day. The final measure of success must never be how many you get into the building but how many in the building are experiencing God reproducing His life in them.

When one understands the true nature of revival he could never rightly conclude that they are no longer needed or relevant in our day. In fact the very opposite is true, revival has never been more needed.

May the prevalence of wickedness in our day be a call to God's people to come together once again for a time of "Solemn Assembly." Revival, among God's people, is still the way He chooses to stem the tide of wickedness in our day.


t cannot be denied that the cost of holding a revival campaign in a local church continues to rise higher and higher. needed a radio for my 1934 two-door sedan street rod and it was a problem. The car had a 6-volt negative ground electrical system. All the modern stereos are 12volt positive ground radios. I went to the best place in Olathe for this kind of thing. It was there that over twenty years ago I first met Steve Jones. Figuring out how to make this work was a long and arduous process. Neither Steve nor his brother Eldon had ever faced this challenge before.

All of us who want to bring people to Christ BY ALL MEANS have a bell inside of us. When we have a prospect that God has been getting ready for us to share with the bell inside goes off. Kind of like a bobber going under. I knew that Steve Jones had been put into my sights, the bell was ringing and the bobber was out of sight. Getting the stereo to work took many visits. Inverters and converters and power packs were all a part of it. As an aside, with that Flathead humming and those two Rochester carbs sucking and my stereo doin' tunes, well no need trying to explain it



if you've never been there.

Through it all we had the Jones's over for some of Jeanne's cooking several times, cigarettes and all. We supplied an ash tray and Steve stunk up our house. You see this BY ALL MEANS is some times inconvenient. We had a revival at our church a few weeks after the street rod project was over. Dr. Curtis Smith, founding president of Mid-America Nazarene University was the

preacher. Believe me, we have had very few men as gifted as Curt Smith in our pulpits. We sat next to the front about four rows back. At the altar time both Steve and Melissa went forward and were gloriously saved. Steve's smoking stopped right there. He had really been delivered. A week or so later his brother asked me what had happened to Steve. He was very intelligent and frankly I was a little afraid to share Christ with him. But I did and he was soon a glowing Christian. In their business they were duplicating eight track tapes for people. It was very lucrative. They would sell you the blank tape and let you use their duplicators. It was skirting the copyright laws. Soon after Eldon's conversion, without ever being told, he walked down stairs and pulled the plugs on the duplicators. Yes, the Jones boys really got saved.

Now more than twenty years later Steve is a successful corporate manager with all three children married and in the church. Eldon and his wife Mary and little daughter Megan are headed to Kenya Africa as missionaries. No it's not all done from the pulpit. It takes ALL MEANS.



But finally, it was Sunday morning, and the evangelist gave his invitation one more time. The seekers began to come. And yes, you are right! I looked up and there was Doris at the altar praying her way to God, with mom on one side and dad on the other! That evening, Doris brought Charlie with her to the last revival service, and before the evangelist could preach, Charlie was at the altar too!

Those praying parents not only saw their daughter gloriously saved in revival, but God gave them a wonderful Christian young man to be a godly influence on their daughter for years to come. I have had the privilege of officiating their wedding, dedicating their three children, and now Charlie is one my most faithful church board members.

What is the cost of revival? Whatever it is, it's worth it! Doris thinks so, her parents think so, and Charlie thinks so ... even our accountant-treasurer at the church thinks so! I would never be so crass as to reduce the benefit of a good revival to economics, but it is obvious to me that the biblical stewardship of Charlie and Doris has not only paid for the revival in which they were saved but also many revivals since.


